Pastor's Message

A Prayer for Holy Week

Lord Jesus, when You entered Jerusalem on that Palm Sunday, You knew what was ahead for You. I praise and thank You that You did not turn back but went willingly to the cross to accomplish my salvation. On that day, the multitudes hoped that You had come to be their earthly king, help me when my own thoughts and desires are earth-bound and falling short of Your perfect will and purpose. As I see You enthroned on Your cross and reigning in majesty at the Father's right hand, lead me always to confess You as my King.

At the Passover meal on Thursday evening, You washed the feet of Your disciples. Though Lord of all, You made Yourself a Servant. I praise You that You have also washed me, cleansing me from all sin by Your gift of Holy Baptism. In that washing, You exulted me to high status as a child of God, seating me in the heavenly places. Therefore, help me, being so exulted by You, to become a Servant in likeness to You. Give me a willing heart to seek the good others and to serve them.

Lord, on that same Holy Thursday, You sat at table with the Twelve, as the true Passover Lamb. And as you gave thanks for bread and wine, You gave the new Passover Supper. "This My body given for you." "This is My blood shed for you." As often as I eat the bread and drink the cup, grant me to come in repentance and faith to receive Your promised gifts. Comfort me in the promise of sin forgiven. Cheer me by Your drawing near. Strengthen me by this holy food all the days of my earthly pilgrimage and by it bring me to Your kingdom that will have no end.

Blessed Jesus in Your arrest on Thursday evening, You suffered bitter betrayal. Have mercy on this sinner, who has also betrayed You by sins of thought, of word, and deed. Grant me repentance to life. Forgive me and strengthen my faith.

Lord Jesus I praise You for that dreadful Friday on which You gave Your life for Me. Your enemies hurled bitter accusations against You and cried out for Your crucifixion, and You bore it willingly for my sake. You were cruelly beaten and mocked, but endured it in love for me. They drove nails through Your hands and feet, yet You refused to come down from the cross. You did it all for me. And I can never thank You sufficiently, not in all eternity. And yet I praise that I have eternity to try. I thank You that by Your death You have given me life. Jesus remember me in Your Kingdom!

Savior, on that Holy Saturday when Your body was entombed, Your flesh was kept from decay. Remember my weak flesh, that I am dust. And when my body is laid to rest, grant my soul to be at rest in You. Though my body decay, keep my remains until the Day of the Resurrection of all flesh, when You will transform me in likeness to Your glory.

O Jesus Christ, Redeemer of the world, my Lord, my Savior, and my God – to You belongs all glory, honor and praise forever. Though You died on, You are risen again, just as You said. By Your death You destroyed death, and by Your rising again You have given me endless life. Alleluia, alleluia! Grant me with gladness of heart and with the joy that only You can give to celebrate Your victory in the glad company of Your people. Give heart to our songs and strength to our praise. And help us to share the glad news with all who need to hear.

Lord Jesus, in this Holy Week be near me. As I think upon all that You have done in love for me, lead me to love You the more, and serve You the better. To You, with Your Father and the Holy Spirit be glory forever. Amen.
