Pastor's Message

THE LONG LENT

Our first drive-in service was held on Easter Sunday 2020. It was great to be together as God's church, but it was far from the kind of Easter we would have preferred. The pandemic had settled into our lives sometime in the middle of Lent last year and, to me, it has felt like Lent ever since.

Among the liturgical adjustments we make during Lent is the suppression of alleluias. The ancient Hebrew acclamation which means, "Praise ye the Lord!" is set aside for a season of penitential reflection. Omitting our alleluias draws our attention to the solemnity of the season and it stokes our appetite to shout and sing our praises with renewed zeal on Easter Sunday. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Easter came last year right on schedule, as did Christmas and we sang and said our alleluias, and yet... And yet there has remained a Lent-like pall over our life together as this pandemic continues to roll on. We've been keeping our distance and hiding our faces behind masks – as love for our neighbors suggest we should do – but these things have made us isolated. So many of the activities that have defined our life together have been cancelled or modified, including the divine service.

These things weary us and sometimes anger us. In this, our long Lent, we can't wait to get back to those alleluias – back to normal. We can't wait to be fully united again as one family of God in one place. God grant it soon to happen. And God grant us patience and faith to endure in the meanwhile.

But if this pandemic – this winter of our discontent – is to be likened to the season of Lent, let us pray that God will use this time to do in us what Lent is made to do. May God use this difficult season (no matter how long it persists) to turn our thoughts and affections more

fully to Jesus Christ and Him crucified. May He break our sinful reliance on self, and lead us to seek only Him. May He break down our defenses and that would refuse His reign in every aspect of our lives. May He lead us to see Jesus, bleeding and dying on the cross as our only Savior, our only life, our only joy.

And when the Lord has led us through every Lent that is yet to come, may He bring us at last, by His grace, to the endless Easter of our Savior's eternal kingdom.
