Pastor's Message

TOLL ROAD

In a news release that surprised exactly no one, the Pennsylvania Turnpike announced an increase in tolls that took effect earlier this year. Driving the turnpike from one end to the other will now cost you almost \$113. (It's a good thing that gas is so cheap.)

That toll may seem like a lot but I've been reminded in this past year that highways are not the only thing that exact tolls. Life takes a toll. As we deal with small daily troubles and the seemingly endless tide of bigger ones, it wears us down. And while this is always true, it was especially true in the turmoil of the past year, especially in regards to the pandemic. Covid-19 effected almost every area of our lives including work, church, and our interpersonal relationships. At present, we're only beginning to calculate the cost – not only in economic terms but especially in human terms. To put it simply, the tolls for 2020 (at least for most us) were much higher than we've been accustomed to paying. We may be soldiering on with our life's activities but there is emotional, spiritual, and physical weariness dragging on us. And what do we do?

What we should not do is start looking for the exits! If you're on the PA Turnpike you may be looking at a different route to save a few dollars, and there's no problem with that. But in life looking for an exit may look like someone backing away from family and friends, or disengaging from church, or giving themselves over to despair. We need to keep a careful watch on ourselves and those around us to keep us all on the road.

What we do need is refreshment from Jesus. When life's tolls are high it's especially important that we spend time in God's house and in His Word. We need the Savior to minister to us, strengthen us, help us, encourage us, and be near us. We can't go another mile without Him.

He has put up a billboard on the toll road that says: "Come to Me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." It's His invitation to pull off that road for a bit and stop racking up those tolls – to refuel at the rest stop where He provides for us. And I would suggest that you make it a protracted stop. Give yourself some extra time that Jesus work on you, renew you by His gifts, and share His rest with you.

That rest is yours in God's house as Jesus speaks to you in His Word and feeds You with His Supper. By His Means of Grace God strengthens and renews us for the long haul and keeps us going toward the wonderful destination that He has prepared for us.

You might also consider enjoying that rest in an extended way. Our District President, Pastor Chris Wicher, regularly encourages pastors and others to take a DAWG Day – a "Day Alone With God". The idea is to take some time off, take your Bible and hymnal, and find a quiet place to read, and pray, and rest, and study. Turn the phone off, leave the computer at home. Let the traffic on that toll road keep roaring by without you. Rest. And as Luther says in his hymn about the Sabbath Day "put aside the work you do, so that God may work in you."

As I was writing this article, I thought back to that time many years ago when I would take my family back to New York to visit family. Often during those visits my grandpa would take me aside and press a fifty-dollar bill into my hand to pay for gas and tolls. That's a picture of heaven when the Lord will restore to us all that was lost in our journey and will make us whole. And He, our Lord, who paid the highest toll in love for us on the cross will welcome us home to stay.

(1) Through March we expected to have a deficit of \$2,038.00 but actually have a surplus of \$2,665.54. However, that surplus is primarily the result of an unanticipated contribution of \$3,000.00 in January. Nevertheless, even removing the \$3,000.00 contribution from the equation, our deficit would only be \$334.54 versus the budgeted deficit of \$2,038.00.

(2) The blame for any "deficit" would lie in the insurance line item. The Board did not anticipate a significant increase in our property insurance bill for 2021. We budgeted \$2,000.00 while the actual bill came to \$2,623.50.

(3) On the whole, though, we are doing very well financially through the first quarter of 2021.
