With the celebration of the Reformation of 504 years ago behind us, we now find ourselves looking toward a new celebration this November 7th. It is on this Sunday that we observe All Saints Day. All Saints' Day, also called The Feast of All Saints, is a day commemorating all the saints of the church, both known and unknown, who have been called home. It is celebrated on November 1 in the Western churches and on the first Sunday after Pentecost in the Eastern churches.

The origin of All Saints' Day cannot be traced with certainty, and it has been			
observed on various days in different places. A feast of all martyrs was kept			
on May 13 in the Eastern church according to Ephraem Syrus (died c. 373),			
which may have determined the choice of May 13 by Pope Boniface IV when			
he dedicated the Pantheon in Rome as a church in honor of the Virgin Mary			
and all martyrs in 609. The first evidence for the November 1 date of celebration and of the broadening of the festival to include all saints as well			
as all martyrs occurred during the reign of Pope Gregory III (731–741), who



1-Our large increase in income for September was due to reimbursement from Zion for the Pastor's salar 2-Our repair and maintenance line item for Y-T-D was budgeted at \$3,550.00. We actually spent \$9,720. repairs that have been long overdue.

3-The September numbers have normalized our Y-T-D numbers. We will run deficits in October and November, then normalize again in December since we bill Zion quarterly.
