Pastor's Message

WHY TRI ?

As I write, committees of the Tri-Parish (Bethel - Glenshaw, St. John's - Millvale; Zion – Lawrenceville) are meeting to discuss the nature and work of a potential union of our three parishes. These are only discussions at this point, sanctioned by the voters of each parish. Any agreement to enact a merger will require further discussion and approval by the voters of each parish. My goal in this article is to set forth some of the principles behind the Tri-Parish discussions.

THE SITUATION. We have three LCMS congregations which share a common confession and mission as well as common values concerning the conduct of the Divine Service. (We are united already in faith and practice.) The members of our churches live in overlapping, geographical patterns. All three parishes have seen decline in the last several decades. Each remains viable, but there has been fatigue among leaders, and uncertainty about the future.

More than two years ago, the three parishes began to share midweek services together, and to host common Bible studies, social events, and mission work (including the publication of *"Bible Stories in Pictures"* in the Lisu language of Burma.) At the same time discussions began as to whether we might be more effective in kingdom work if we show a more substantial unity.

THE PLAN. On March 1 of this year an informational meeting for the three parishes was held at Cherry City Fire Hall. The 3-2-1 proposal was set before the members of the congregations, which is the idea of maintaining 3 locations, with 2 pastors, but having only 1 congregation with a united budget,

board, and mission. Each congregation subsequently gave approval for formal discussions to begin, the results of which are to be returned to the voters. Some of the principles and causes that seemed to recommend consideration of a 3-2-1 merger were:

- <u>Better Use of People Power.</u> Each of the parishes struggles to fill a slate of officers and tends to have the same people shuffling responsibilities year after year. This can lead to burn-out in leadership, but more critically expends a lot of people power. In a scenario where one president, one treasurer, one secretary, etc. are needed instead of three of each those other leaders will be freed to use their time and talents in other avenues of service that will benefit the church and its mission.
- <u>Better Use of Material Resources.</u> Similarly, sharing office staff, copy machines, service contracts, supply contracts, and insurance policies should yield substantial savings that could be better used for kingdom work.
- 3) Preservation and Extension of Ministry. The principle of maintaining 3 locations expresses a desire to maintain a witness for Christ in the neighborhoods where God has placed us. For too many years our LCMS congregations in Pittsburgh have ceded territories by closing congregations. Could some of those closures have been prevented if congregations hadn't been so worried about preserving their individual legacies? We can't say. We can hope, however, that by mutual support we can both preserve and extend God's work in Lawrenceville, Millvale, and Glenshaw.
- 4) Preparing for Future Challenges. Long before Covid-19 changed the worship practices of many, all of our churches were asking questions about what the future would look like. The 3-2-1 Plan aims to position our congregations to meet an uncertain future with hope. We also have in mind the looming clergy shortage in our synod which is expected to bring the retirement of a full third of all active pastors within a decade, far exceeding the numbers of new pastors our seminaries are producing. We can be sure that whatever the future brings, it will look different from the past.
- 5) <u>Set A Pattern for Others.</u> Congregations all over the country are struggling, and we have an opportunity to create a model that others could follow. By God's grace we don't want the future to happen to us we want to shape the future. If we are successful, it seems likely that other congregations will be asking us how to set out on a similar journey with those sister parishes that are near to them.
